Wrapped in a flashback of then-octogenarian Adele, rediscovering the letters during World War I, the narrative begins shortly after Celine s death. Her dying wish was that Adele be given the letters. As she reads them Adele remembers her childhood and youth and learns about her mother s life. The reader learns what happened to the characters...
